12. Home Safe: Serving the Homeless in Los Angeles and Placer Counties (2:00 p.m.)

Juliet Webb, Deputy Executive Director - Child and Family Policy Institute of California (CFPIC)

Erin Van Duzer, Adult Services Project Director - Child and Family Policy Institute of California (CFPIC)

David Kochen, Human Services Administrator II - Los Angeles County Adult Protective Services

Presenters reviewed the history of the Home Safe homeless prevention grant program and described the different innovations developed by county APS programs to prevent

older adult homelessness. Eviction prevention, temporary housing and extensive case management have been hallmarks of the new program. The \$92.5 million budget allocation in 2021 will support expansion of the program statewide and support the increased client base from the recent change in eligibility to adults aged 60 and over.

13. Lauren Miranda, Community Manager, Alive Ventures

Ms. Miranda discussed the work of Alive Ventures, a company that supports the development of innovative products to benefit older adults. Product design and development is done through focus groups of older adults who advise and inform product developers.
